Sporting the classic *bandido* we have these handsome chaps. Sombrero, bandoliers a rifle and a couple of revolvers.



Or modelled by some *Adelitas*, white tops & long skirts or dresses, with the defining bandoliers & sombreros



For the most martially inclined **Field uniform** is pretty much the same regardless of rank. Plain & shapeless offwhite tunic & trousers. Boots or shoes are both possible. Peaked hat, often of the same material as the uniform.



The higher classes may prefer **Dress uniform** modelled by a young Porfirio Diaz in 1861.
